In Italy & France union activists believe improvements must be forced upon management - they must be enacted by workers themselves; they must take control of the work process; they will be given rights of control only after they have taken control already.

The AFL-CIO has produced two new publications in its continuing campaign for national health security -- the Federation's No. 1 legislative goal.

1. HEALTH SECURITY--BEST BUY FOR UNION MEMBERS is a clear, simply written flyer for union members explaining the relationship between union health and welfare plans and national health security.

2. CATASTROPHIC INSURANCE--BLESSING OR DISGUISE? similarly discusses the relationship between this limited form of protection and national health security.
